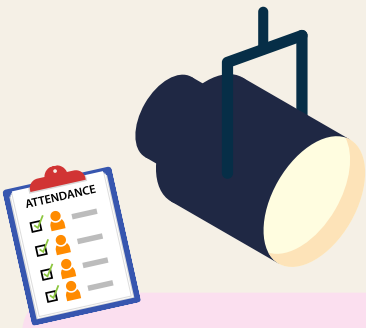

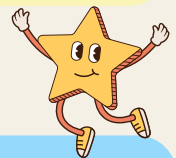
## SEND SPOTLIGHT
