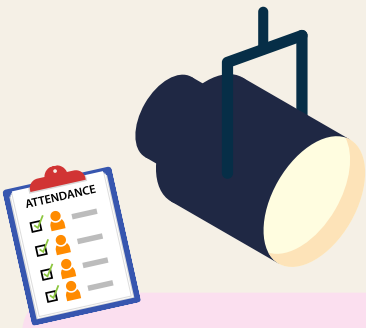

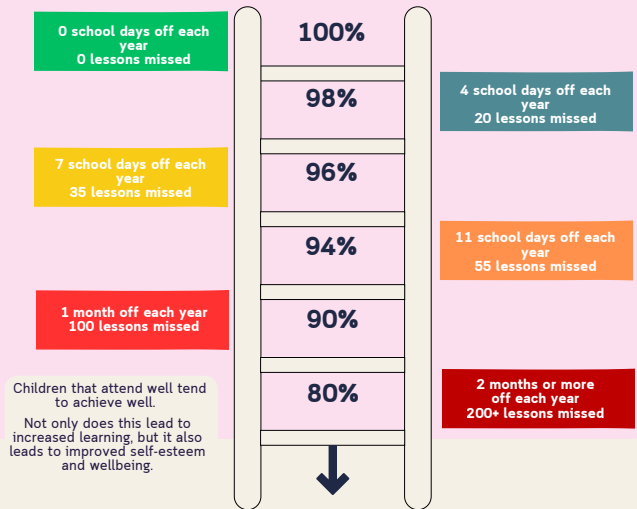
Absence from School

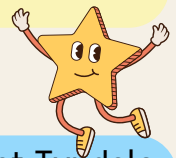


SEND SPOTLIGHT

The new SEND White Paper aims to improve support for children with additional needs by focusing on earlier help, clearer processes and more consistent support across schools. Existing support, including EHCPs, is not being removed. Changes will happen gradually, and parents will continue to be involved in decisions about their child. Overall, the aim is to make the SEND system fairer, clearer and less stressful for families.



CHARACTER SPOTLIGHT



One of the important Character habits we encourage all children to develop at Tyndale is being 'Safe'. Being safe means looking after themselves and others, making sensible choices, and following rules both in and out of school. You can help reinforce this at home by talking together about what safety looks like in everyday life – from road safety and how to cross safely, to staying safe online, and choosing safe ways to play with friends. Having regular conversations about these topics helps children understand their responsibility to care for themselves and those around them, supporting this key Character habit.
