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Reception:

Reception have been enjoying Easter activities this week! Pupils have made Easter Bonnets with their adults, Easter cards and chocolate nest cakes to take home. They are continuing to apply their knowledge of their sounds to write words, phrases and sentences. All the children wrote about their favourite activity this week. In maths, they are focussing on numbers to 25 and their understanding of number bonds to 10.

Year 1:

Year 1 have been absolutely fantastic at settling into their new classroom as a full team this week. They have been enjoying Teatime in Space in English lessons, all linked to the alien that visited the classroom recently. In maths, pupils have shown determination in solidifying their knowledge of subtracting up to 50, by using dienes. They also had a fun and creative afternoon with the Easter Bonnet making workshop. The end results were all so creative and individual, Miss Cox was very impressed with her children's craft skills!

Year 2:

What a busy couple of weeks it has been in Year 2. Pupils have learnt a new dance routine as well as a new song in choir! But most of all, the children really enjoyed our Easter crafts workshop. They are a very creative class! To finish term 4, they have been writing the story of 'Something Fishy', as well as a non-chronological report about sharks. Pupils all learnt some amazing facts. In maths, they have been understanding units of measure and using this to compare objects by mass and length.

Year 3:

Year 3 have had a busy couple of weeks. They have adapted well to change when required, showing great adaptability! A highlight this fortnight includes a dance session led by a local dance school, where pupils got the chance to learn a choreographed dance. Their science lessons have allowed the pupils to discover changing matter, deciding whether cornflour starch was a solid or a liquid and how a seal is created by polymers when pencils are put through bags of water.

Year 4:

Over the past two weeks, Year 4 have been learning about rhyming couplets and have made their own poems about witches using rhyming couplets. They have also thoroughly enjoyed designing, creating and evaluating their DT projects, where they made potion pots in relation to their topic theme - ExPELLIARMUS.

Year 5:

Over the past couple of weeks, Year 5 have enjoyed a range of diverse lessons! This includes designing and creating an Egyptian death mask, going on not one, but two, scavenger hunts during English to help them with word classes and progressive tense, and using 'decimal stations' in Maths. Year 5 are sad to see Miss Piper-Thompson leave who has been with us the last term for her teacher training placement! Good luck with everything in the future Miss, from all of us in Year 5!

Year 6:

Year 6 have been brilliant the past fortnight and have made all the staff at Tyndale very proud, whilst earning lots of gold coins! They have had 4 successful days of SATs mocks, demonstrating hard-work, resilience and positivity. A highlight this fortnight has been their fun Science experiments with Miss Hall, which consisted of building marshmallow skyscrapers and testing insulating materials using coffee and a range of materials. Pupils have also enjoyed getting competitive on Kahoot, completing a variety of different quizzes.
