The Best Chance of Success



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Reception:

Reception have had an exciting fortnight learning all about mini beasts, with a particular focus on ladybirds. They have used their outdoor area to help them with their learning. In maths, they have been focusing on understanding vocabulary around time whilst continuing to work on learning number bonds to 10 and 20.

Year 1:

Year 1 have started a brand new topic in the last two weeks: Spots and stripes. They grouped animals based on what they eat. They were sad to learn that animals eat other animals! Year 1 have also thoroughly enjoyed discovering their very own imaginary candy land in Literacy lessons. They have used their drama skills to swim in the chocolate river and jump to catch the cotton candy cloud and they have also produced some extended noun phrases to describe their candy lands.

Year 2:

Year 2 have recently started the topic 'Roses are red, Lavender is blue'. Pupils have enjoyed learning about the different parts of plants, taking plants apart and labelling them. On Monday, Year 2 had a very special letter delivered from the 'Giant'. He told them that they should not believe Jack in the story 'Jack and The Beanstalk' and instead read his version of events in the book 'Trust Me, Jack's Beanstalk Stinks!' The class have been comparing both of these stories and writing descriptions of the characters. Pupils have also used inspiration from the artist Andrew Goldsworthy to create their own art out of natural materials. Year 2 said this lesson was "the best ever!"

Year 3:

Year 3 have had a very exciting start to the term gaining some new classmates. They are now the proud keepers of European eels, which they are looking after for 4 weeks before releasing back into the local river system. Daily tasks include feeding the eels and cleaning the water which they have been diligently helping with. Their English and Topic lessons have focused on The Iron Man, robots and discovering different forces.

Year 4:

Over the past two weeks, Year 4 have started their new topic which is Battlefields. They have been focusing on the Battle of Hastings and have enjoyed exploring different parts of this topic. In English, they have produced a fabulous piece of writing about the Battle of Hastings comparing the three different contenders for the throne.

Year 5:

Over the last couple of weeks, Year 5 have enjoyed a range of learning activities. They thoroughly enjoyed finding out information about Henry VIII by walking around the classroom and making notes from posters stuck up on walls. They also enjoyed using the Chromebooks to find interesting facts about him - one being he exploded in his coffin because of his weight! Year 5 have had a great start to the term, well done!

Year 6:

Year 6 have been working hard in core subjects, mastering SPaG, arithmetic and maths reasoning prior SATs next week! They have enjoyed playing rounders, basketball and Kahoot with Ms Stewart. They enjoyed trying new things this fortnight such as creating their own blackout poetry, street art and food tasting with Ms Hall! Pupils have enjoyed spending their gold coins this week that they earned from all their hard work and resilience!
