Reception:

Reception have again had a very busy two weeks. A highlight for many was Sports Day and the staff were very proud of their determination to do well and to support their peers. Art work inspired by Mondrian and Kandinsky provided our inspiration for the kindness project. The children used different media including pens, watercolours and wax crayons to create their pieces. They have also been designing and icing cakes to give to parents at the celebration event held today where they shared their learning and performed a selection of their favourite songs from their first year of school.

Year 2:

It has been a busy time in Year 2 over the last couple of weeks! A highlight of the children's learning has been performance poetry. They practised performing poems with expression, intonation and actions in groups to the whole class. The children then created their own seaside poems using their senses. It was great to see how the children also linked their poems to all of the information they have learnt about beaches in the past in their history lessons. Year 2 particularly enjoyed The Kindness project and they followed their class mantra of 'Year 2 spread happiness with a compliment and a smile'. Children wrote out compliments to each in addition to carrying out random acts of kindness.

Year 4:

Year 4 has had a very busy couple of weeks! They thoroughly enjoyed learning more about their topic (Beneath the Waves) with Mrs Matthews. They have researched information and then used that information to create amazing underwater fact files and mobile hangers. Year 4 have shown resilience and perseverance as there has been a lot of changes in the last two weeks. They amaze staff everyday with how they can adapt to any situation. They have also enjoyed doing their learning outside in the wooded area.
