Headteacher's Update

Thank you to all of the parents who attended events this half term, we are continuously seeking plenty of opportunities to invite you into school to make up for lost time you weren't able to throughout the pandemic. We'll send key dates at least a month in advance and remind you of these via virtual message boards and texts in the meantime.

You may be aware that research is showing an estimated £800 gap between the overall cost-of-living and package for families on means-tested benefits, meaning many will have to look to their local community and churches for support.

We have registered as a **WARM WELCOME SPACE** to offer members of our community a space to come to regularly to reduce the need to heat their homes. **From the week commencing 7th November, Tyndale Primary will be open every afternoon from 12 - 3.30pm for members of the public to come and relax in our warm 'Family Room', have a cuppa and a biscuit and safely join in any school events we have running.**

We have loved rewarding pupils more frequently this term, we have loved the end of term reward today, which is a Film Festival where we transformed the school into a cinema with classrooms showing different screenings of films.

We also had our first termly Celebration Ceremony today, where we awarded our 'bigger' 8 trophies you may have seen in the office waiting area as well as our usual certificates, awards and learning heroes trophies. We invited the parents of the children in receipt of these end of term trophies to witness their big moment. Thank you for coming and well done to all the recipients of awards!

Thank you to all of the donations we received for the Harvest this week, these will all be given to Southern Brooks community hub to contribute to food banks.

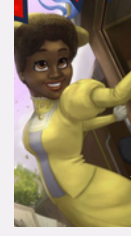

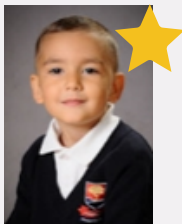

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CLASS UPDATES

RECEPTION

Reception have shown such resilience in practising for their first Harvest festival! They have thoroughly enjoyed learning lots of new songs and did an amazing job during the assembly. In their phonics, they have learnt over 15 new sounds and are learning quite quickly how to blend those sounds together to start their reading. Miss Cox is very proud of them for this! In their maths we have focused on all things patterns, matching and sorting. This has linked nicely sometimes to their 'Stories of the Week'. These are traditional tales that we focus on each week and the children have loved joining in with the words.

YEAR 1

Over the last two weeks, Year 1 have shown great progress in our Learning Heroes focusing on independence and resilience. They have demonstrated this by independently selecting resources from around the classroom to support their learning and not giving up when they have found new learning tricky. Pupils enjoyed having visitors in class this week and asked and answered great questions about the prehistoric era. They learnt about the Bristol dinosaur and then wrote about their workshop using new sounds that they have learnt. In maths children have been learning to use pictures to find the whole and parts and have impressed Ms Bisset so much with their retention of this.

YEAR 2

Year 2 have worked so hard this half term and have shown they are using all their learning powers. They have been ambitious in using both expanded noun phrases and conjunctions in their English work. They have shown resilience in tackling word problems in maths. They have shown collaboration in working as a class and key stage for our Harvest assembly this week. They have demonstrated increased independence throughout the term with the routines and expectations now they are in Year 2. Ms Milverton is extremely proud of all the children for their amazing achievements this term.



YEAR 3

Year 3 has had an amazing last few weeks of term. They have completed their first RE day where they learnt all about the Hindu festival Diwali. They have also completed multiple exciting science experiments, one with skittles, and another (very messy) one with OOBLECK. In English they have been working really hard to complete their diary entries from a character's perspective and they have been incredible to read so far!

YEAR 4

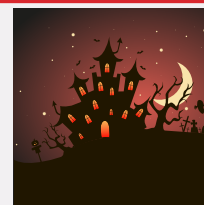
Year 4 have worked extremely hard with their assessments and have used our learning powers continuously throughout. They have also enjoyed designing and creating their own Iroquois tribe headdress. For this activity, they used great collaboration and independence. Year 4 have done lots of lovely learning, including learning British Sign Language during music, improved their team working skills and working hard to learn lines for their Harvest recital. This term, all pupils have worked really hard in everything that we have done! Ms Hyndman is so proud of each and every one of them and they should be really proud of themselves too.

YEAR 5

Year 5 worked very hard completing their assessments last week and Ms Stewart is very proud of everyone! In English, pupils have enjoyed writing their own adventure narrative, focusing on using figurative language, speech and past tense consistently. In maths, there has been a big focus on statistics and pupils are now able to draw a bar chart and line graph and interpret information from charts and tables. It has been great to see the uptake in after-school clubs this term in Year 5!

YEAR 6

Year 6 have shown fantastic resilience and independence over the last two weeks. They challenged themselves during assessment week and created some fantastic artwork with Ms Stewart. They have thoroughly enjoyed their Harvest Assembly practices and we are super proud of all of Year 6 for making a great effort with this. Have a fantastic half term!
