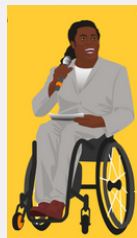

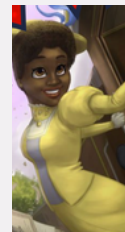

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CLASS UPDATES

RECEPTION

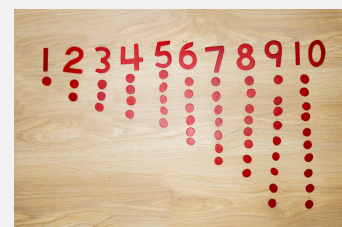
The last two weeks in Reception have been go go go! They've been focusing on their book - The Three Little Pigs. They have loved house building, puppet making and sequencing the story. In maths pupils have been working on all things numbers! Number here, number there and numbers everywhere. Working on their gross motor skills outside, they have been puddle jumping, tyre climbing and chalk marking. Impressively, Reception class have started daily phonic lessons! Pupils have picked this up very quickly and are always excited to learn their next new phoneme (sound) of the day!

YEAR 1

Over the last two weeks Year 1 have been busy exercising as they count forwards and backwards in maths. This has helped them with ordinal numbers where they have been getting into lines saying who is 1st, 2nd and continuing up to 10th. Year 2 have continued to enjoy their learning about Mary Anning and her job as a palaeontologist. They have made their own time line of her life and used their phonics skills to write sentences to match. Children have been working hard on demonstrating our school Learning Heroes and are becoming more independent by selecting sound mats and number lines to help them in lessons.

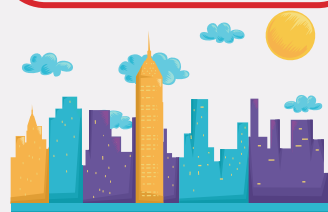
YEAR 2

This week in English the children have been using expanded noun phrases to write character descriptions. In maths, Year 2 have been practising their recall of number bonds to 10. They have spotted the number patterns when recording them! They have also been mixing the primary colours together in art to make the secondary colours.



YEAR 3

This fortnight Year 3 have done lots of amazing activities within their lessons. They all really enjoyed their science investigation into what creates shadows and how they can be changed. In their art this week they have created some incredible 3D cityscapes which are going to be put up on the year 3 display board. In their English this week, Year 3 have been looking into non-chronological reports and have been gathering lots of information about Berlin so that they can write their own next week!



YEAR 4

This fortnight Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed their learning about the Iroquois Tribe. They have designed and sketched their own lighthouses whilst expanding their knowledge on the tribe. They have also created their own incredible two-page spread fact files on the Iroquois tribe which showed creativity, great imagination and resilience. Year 4 have taken part in an Anti-bullying assembly and activity where they worked together as a team showing great qualities linking to our Learning Heroes.



YEAR 5

Year 5 have had an enjoyable fortnight. A highlight has been their 'Playground Leaders' workshop, where they learnt how to lead fun and safe playground games. They then demonstrated independence at breaktimes by leading games for other children. Another highlight has been participating in a science experiment, where they measured how temperature affects the rate of skittles dissolving. In maths, pupils have been using their resources to independently calculate addition and subtraction questions that involved exchanges.



YEAR 6

Over the last fortnight, Year 6 have completed lots of fun learning about Surrealism in their topic lessons and have enjoyed basing their writing on 'The Last Alchemist' in English. Children wrote in role as Spinifex the last Alchemist, and have also been working hard on writing their own precious memories to power the Alchemist's machine. In maths, they have been working diligently to write their own fact families for larger times tables, to support learning on how to answer long division questions.
