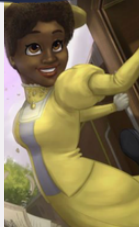

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CLASS UPDATES

RECEPTION

Reception have been carrying on their learning with all things animals! Whilst they previously learnt all about African Savannah animals, this week they travelled to the north and south pole to learn all about polar animals! Their fact writing has been amazing, using their phonics knowledge and concentrating on capital letters and finger spaces. In maths, they've been focusing on comparing length and height, using string, blocks and even each other to compare what or who is tallest and shortest. This week they've focused on making 10, using numicon and counters - they've been very confident with this!

YEAR 1

Year 1 have been very busy making story maps in English and have used them to help them retell the story of the Three Little Pigs in sequence. The class were lucky enough to have the Big Bad Wolf and the First Little Pig visit the classroom. The children enjoyed practising asking questions using the question starters; who, what, when, where, why and how. In maths Year 1 have been amazing mathematicians, using tens frames and counters to find related facts in a fact family.

YEAR 2

Year 2 have been continuing their learning journey of the Tudors and have written fact files about Henry VIII's six wives. They have also been exploring what types of food the Tudors ate and have followed a recipe to make Tudor bread. They certainly enjoyed tasting it once it was baked, and even gave it a score of 10/10 on taste! In maths, the children have continued to learn about measurement and have explored weighing mass using grams and kilogrammes, and capacity using millilitres and litres.



YEAR 3

Year 3 has had a very busy couple of weeks! In English they have been working very hard on their Iron Man work, even having a heated debate about what should be done with him now that he has been captured! Year 3 has also enjoyed the start of their new maths module on mass and capacity, using all of their mathematical language has shown just how amazing they are as mathematicians. Also, in science they have been learning all about magnets and have planned and actioned some great investigations. Keep up the amazing work Year 3!



YEAR 4

Year 4 have explored and researched the events of the Battle of Hastings 1066 and have created and designed time lines using the information they previously had and new information they have found out by researching. This has informed them to then create a recount of the Battle in English using various language features. They have thoroughly enjoyed taking a step back in History to discover how times change. They have also worked extremely hard in maths where they have just completed their unit on multiplication and division and have just started learning about fractions. Well done Year 4 - lots of lovely learning!



YEAR 5

Year 5 have had a superb two weeks of learning. They have loved learning new phrases in different languages as part of their Character Education challenge this fortnight. They created posters to show case their understanding. In maths, Year 5 have demonstrated a strong understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages and have been answering questions such as finding a percentage of a number. In Learning for Life, the class explored body image and ways to promote a positive body image. A highlight this week has been completing their orienteering scavenger hunt in pairs on the field, as part of their Outdoor Adventurous Activities unit in P.E.



YEAR 6

Year 6 has been as resilient as ever this week. They make every adult that they work with so proud due to their perseverance and determination to be successful. They have been busy writing a balanced argument this week about xenotransplantation. Year 6 have also started a new maths unit, Statistics, which they are excelling at. Keep it up Year 6 - you are fantastic!

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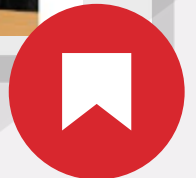
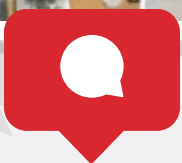

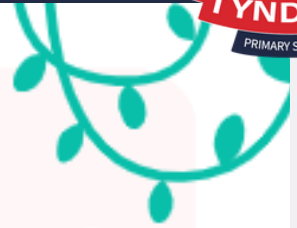
