




Headship Team Update




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RECEPTION

YEAR 1

Year 1 has had a wonderful start to this term and have shown great enthusiasm for our new theme, Moving and Growing. They have enjoyed getting to know Bob, the main character in our English text and have used adjectives to describe the moon he works

on. They have begun to learn about significant people from the past including Katherine Johnson and Neil Armstrong and used events in their life to create a timeline. In Maths they have shown enjoyment in measure, using non-standard objects to measure everything in our classroom! Keep it up Year 1!

how they invaded Britannia. They have

shown creativity when writing a

description all about the equipment,

skills.
