I am delighted to announce that we are developing our playgrounds over the summer holidays! This is a long overdue project that I am extremely excited about.

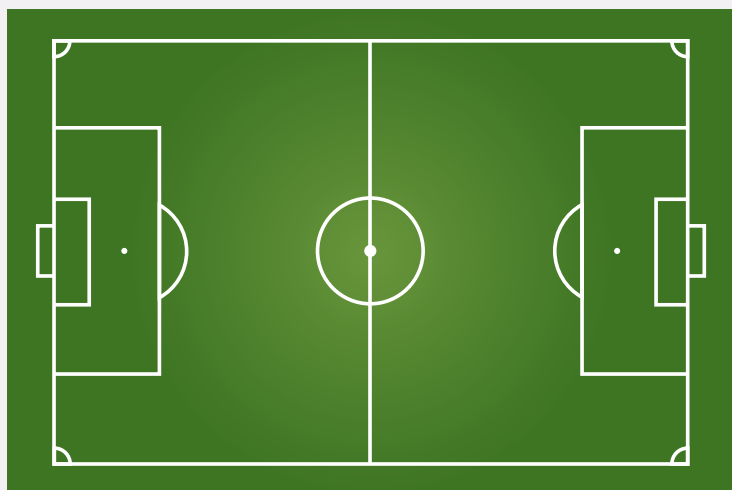
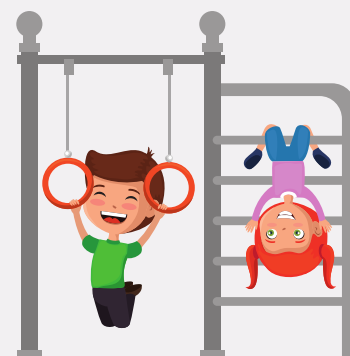
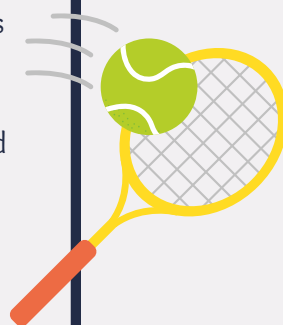
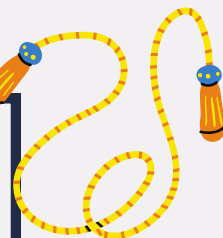
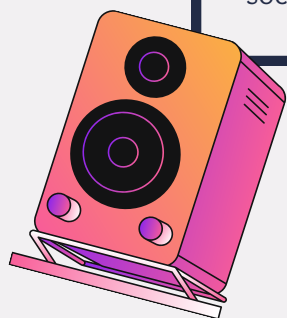
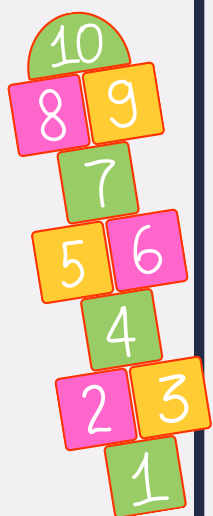
When our pupils return to us in September, on the KS1 playground, there will be bright and colourful thermoplastic markings on the ground. On the grass area, there will be a climbing frame with a spongy, astroturf surface underneath for safety.

On the KS2 playground, there will be bright and colourful thermoplastic markings, a climbing frame with the same safety astroturf flooring and there will also be two designated sports MUGA areas safely fenced off for ball games.

In addition to this, we have purchased 7 colourful plastic picnic tables which will be shared between the two playgrounds for creative activities and of course, our disco dancing areas will remain for all of our ambitious performers to enjoy!

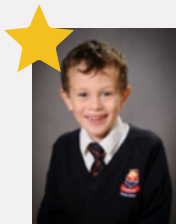

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## CLASS UPDATES

### RECEPTION

Reception have been continuing their work on 'people who help us' and have been so fantastic with their story writing linked to this theme! Reception are focusing on finger spaces and short sentences and they have been amazing. In maths, they have been working hard on adding two numbers together, using manipulatives and writing their number sentences. They have thoroughly enjoyed PE this term as they have been doing multiple assault courses and have been learning to throw and catch working in pairs!

### YEAR 1

Year 1 has been busy writing the story of Man on the Moon. They have done so well remembering to use finger spaces and capital letters and have even included adjectives. The children have been comparing length and height of objects using centimetres and this week they have been comparing capacity and volume. In science the children have been using their knowledge of leaves and trees to decide if a tree is evergreen or deciduous. In history the children have learnt about different astronauts and their space travel. They have become very confident with this learning and can tell you the reason that these astronauts are significant people.

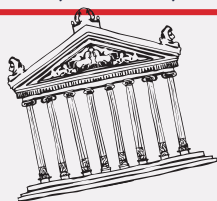
### YEAR 2

Year 2 has had a great first few weeks. They have been working so hard in preparing for their SATs which will take place in the mornings next week! They enjoyed the visit from the South Gloucestershire Road Safety Team - and learnt all about the green Cross Code (Think - Stop - Look All round - Walk). In English, they have been planning and writing their own stories using the text 'Into the Forest' as a stimulus. In Maths, they have been learning about telling the time using quarter past, half past and quarter to.



### YEAR 3

Year 3 have had an exceptional few weeks! They have really tried to immerse themselves in our theme of Ancient Greece and have created some incredible work. In English they have created a class book filled with non-chronological reports about the Greek gods and goddesses. This has helped them to also create some incredible Ancient Greek inspired pottery! Then in maths, they have just begun to work on the new topic of time which they are showing great dedication to already. Well done year 3.



### YEAR 4

Year 4 have created and published a fantastic piece of writing in English - instructions on how to dress like a Roman Legionary. They have used all of their knowledge they have learned so far and their steps to success to create a lovely two page spread in their books. In Maths, they have been looking at money and how to calculate using money. They have become very confident when working with money! They also have classified plants by hunting for various ones around the school building.

### YEAR 5

Year 5 have planned, edited and written persuasive arguments this week all about why we must stop deforestation. They have used their knowledge from our geography lessons and their own independent research to make their argument very strong. They have also shown a fantastic interest in our science lessons all about reproduction in animals and have learnt some very tricky words like oviparous and viviparous.



### YEAR 6

The pride on every Year 6 pupil's face after they have completed an assessment this week has been phenomenal. They have worked so hard and have shown fantastic amounts of resilience in the run up to their SATs. Year 6 are looking forward to learning more about WWII and conducting more experiments involving circuits in Science. Keep it up Year 6!
