We would like to remind all parents and carers of the importance of ensuring children are in school each day on time. Children start the day with Class Family Time which is a crucial start to each day supporting children to develop character, empathy and belonging. From Years 1-6, children must be in their classes by 08:40 (EYFS is 08:50). Class teachers will now open their classroom doors 5 minutes before children need to be in. Thank you for your support with this - every minute counts!

We would like to remind all parents and carers about our Child and Family Team, who are always available to support you and to keep our children safe and happy at school. If your child is having a tricky morning then just inform us with a written post-it note or message to the office stating the phrase 'handle with care' and we will know to take extra time and patience to support your child with no questions asked! 
YEAR 5

YEAR 6



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

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

E-SCOOTERS AND THE LAW

It is against the law to ride a privately-owned electric scooter (e-scooter) on a public road or pavement. We understand that buying an e-scooter can be tempting, especially as you can buy them from many popular retailers.

Current law

You can buy an e-scooter, but you can't ride it on a UK public road, cycle lane or pavement. The only place those e-scooters can be used is on private land with the landowner's permission.

As e-scooters do not have number plates, signalling ability and do not always have visible rear lights, they can't be used legally on the roads.

Why is this?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEV's), so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements, such as:

- MOT
- licensing
- tax
- insurance

What happens if I'm stopped by the police?

The police will advise you of the current law on using an e-scooter legally and have the powers to seize it. Alongside this you could face a fine and/or points on your driving licence as anyone riding an e-scooter, must adhere to the normal traffic laws when on the road. Once seized the e-scooter is destroyed.

E-scooter trials

The UK Government is currently taking part in 'Future Transport Zone' trials for e-scooter hire,

with a view to making them legal to use on the roads. Enquire with your local authority for a trial closest to you.
