RECEPTION

What a fantastic half term this has been for Reception! They have used their developing phonics knowledge to write some beautiful fact files on nocturnal animals. In maths they have mastered adding two numbers together, odds and evens and double numbers using tens frames and part part whole models. They have learnt all about spring and signs of spring including baby animals and their habitats, nocturnal animals and have created some beautiful owl, fox and sunrise and sunset art work.

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
